Writing Prompts on Nature

Elementary:

- 1. Describe what you see outdoors. What's new to you? What's the same? What do you see the most? What's missing?
- 2. How do you feel when you spend time outside, and opposed to when you spend time inside?
- 3. When you go outside, what senses are you most thankful to have? Why?
- 4. Looking at the sky, describe how it changes over time. If possible, do this at sunrise, and again at noon, and again at sunset, and again after it's gotten dark.
- 5. Write a short story about an animal you see outside.

Middle School:

- 1. Write a short story about the adventures of an insect you see outside, like the movie, "Honey, I Shrunk the Kids!"
- 2. Describe a place you'd most like to experience in nature that you've never been to before.
- 3. Explain why you do or do not consider yourself a nature-lover.
- 4. If the big, old trees could talk, what would they say to the younger saplings?
- 5. Imagine you're a soaring bird up above. Describe what you see.

High School:

- 1. Many of the big trees are over a hundred years old. Write about the things they've weathered over the years, and describe what it means to be resilient.
- Describe an environmental injustice in your community, and make a specific call to action.
- 3. Explain how you fit into the natural community of plant and animal life in your neighborhood.
- 4. Capture the minutia in nature. Then, in reverse, capture its grandeur.
